APPROVING RESOLUTION NO. 112-2021 OF THE SANGGUNIANG BAYAN OF BURGOS, PANGASINAN, ENTITLED “APPROVING THE ANNUAL INVESTMENT PROGRAM FOR CALENDAR YEAR 2022 OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF BURGOS, PROVINCE OF PANGASINAN”

WHEREAS, the Sangguniang Bayan of Burgos, Pangasinan submitted its Resolution No. 112-2021 to the Sangguniang Panlalawigan for review and evaluation pursuant to Section 56 of Republic Act No.7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991;

WHEREAS, the Committee on Laws and Ordinances of the Sangguniang Panlalawigan with the technical assistance of the Provincial Planning and Development Officer have conducted initial review and study on said SB Resolution and found out that the same is in pursuant to Sections 106, 109 and 114 of R.A. 7160;

WHEREAS, the Local Development Council of Burgos, Pangasinan had identified and prioritized programs and projects in their Annual Investment Program for CY 2022. This was endorsed by the Local Development Council to the Sangguniang Bayan on September 2, 2021 thru MDC Resolution No. 2021-004-A and was favorably acted upon by the Sangguniang Bayan on December 6, 2021 thru SB Resolution No. 112-2021;

WHEREAS, the Annual Investment Program of the municipality is in accordance with the Budget Operations Manual (BOM) for Local Government Units – 2016 Edition and in pursuance to DILG-NEDA-DBM-DOF Joint Memorandum Circular No. 1, Series of 2007 dated 08 March 2007 and DBM-CCC-DILG JMC No. 2014-dated August 7, 2014, as amended by DBM-CCC-DILG JMC No. 2015-1 – dated July 23, 2015 as to format and contents. The AIP of Burgos, Pangasinan was formulated following the prescribed AIP Summary Form and covers a) all the regular budgetary requirements for the operation of the different municipal offices broken down into PS, MOOE and Capital Outlay; b) the priority development programs/projects of the LGU including those to be funded by the 20% development fund; c) Disaster Risk Reduction Management Fund Plan; d) Local Climate Change Action Plan; e) Peace and Order Plan; f) Gender and Development Plan; g) Annual Cultural Development Plan; h) Local Nutrition Action Plan; i) Local Youth Development Plan; and j) programs, projects and activities (PPAs) for the Local Council for the Protection of Children, Senior Citizens and Persons with Disabilities, PPAs to combat AIDS and PPAs to address the problems on illegal drugs;

WHEREAS, the proposed AIP of Burgos for CY 2022 has an investment requirement of P798,189,195.00. Funding support for the implementation of which is embodied in their 2022 proposed Annual Budget, in the amount of P152,689,195.00 which was enacted by their Sangguniang Bayan on December 6, 2021 through Appropriation Ordinance No. 06, Series of 2021. The remaining P645,500,000.00 is proposed for funding from external sources/national government agencies (P633,500,000.00) and from the LGU's Special Education Fund (P2,000,000.00);

WHEREAS, this AIP is in accordance with Section 287 of LGC of 1991. More than twenty percent or 20.24% of the LGU's National Tax Allocation (P150,687,177.00), which is equivalent to P30,500,000.00.00 is allocated for development projects based on the Joint DBM-DOF-DILG Memorandum Circular No. 1, dated November 4, 2020 (Revised Guidelines on the Appropriation and Utilization of the Twenty Percent (20%) of the Annual Internal Revenue Allotment (IRA) for Development Projects);

WHEREAS, the Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Plan is integrated in the AIP 2022. However, based on the LFC review on their 2022 Annual Budget, there is a deficiency in the appropriation of 5% LDRRM Fund in the amount of P1,087,480.25. The deficit shall be programmed for disaster risk reduction and management programs and projects in their first Supplemental Investment Program for CY 2022 as per NDRRMC-DBM-DILG Joint Memorandum Circular No. 2013-1 dated March 25, 2013 of the Department of Interior and Local Government (Allocation and Utilization of the Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Fund);

WHEREAS, the LGU of Burgos had also identified programs, projects and activities responsive to Climate Change and tagged its corresponding expenditures in their AIP. This is in pursuance to DBM-CCC-DILG Joint Memorandum Circular No. 2015-01 dated July 23, 2015;

WHEREAS, the Gender and Development Programs, Projects and Activities (GAD-PPAs) attached were reviewed by the DILG Provincial Office and were found to be fully compliant in form and in contents with the provisions of the Joint Memo-Circular (DBM, PCW, DILG & NEDA) No. 2016-01 Amendments to JMC 2013-01 or the Guidelines on the Localization of the Magna Carta of Women;

WHEREAS, as to the Devolution Transition Plan (2022-2024), as one of the supporting documents of this AIP, it is respectfully recommended that the LGU shall strictly observe Item 3.2 of DBM Local Budget Memorandum No. 82-A dated August 19, 2021 which states that “Considering the timeline on the preparation and submission of the LGU DTP under DBM-DILG JMC No. 2021-1, the LCE shall not be mandatorily required to include the LGU DTP as part of the supporting documents of the AIP and the LEP to be submitted to the local sanggunian for budget authorization purposes. However, in case the LGU has already prepared and approved its LGU-DTP, the same may be part of the supporting documents of the AIP and LEP to be submitted by the LCE to the local sanggunian”. Further, Item 6.3.2 of the DBM-DILG Joint Memorandum Circular No. 2021-1 dated August 11, 2021 advised LGUs to “integrate fully assumed responsibilities in the updating of their local development plans, sectoral thematic plans and investment programs”;

WHEREAS, the Sangguniang Panlalawigan, after final evaluation, finds the subject resolution in order, however, compliance with all the existing laws, rules and regulations shall be the responsibility of the Municipal Government of Burgos, Pangasinan;

WHEREFORE, in view of the foregoing, on motion of SP Members Donabel N. Fontelera and Margielou Orange D. Humilde-Verzosa and co-sponsored by SP Members Sheila Marie S. Perez-Galicia, Jerome Vic O. Espino and Jeanne Jinky C. Zaplan, duly seconded, it was—

RESOLVED, by the Sangguniang Panlalawigan in session assembled, to approve Resolution No. 112-2021 of the Sangguniang Bayan of Burgos, Pangasinan, entitled “Approving the Annual Investment Program for Calendar Year 2022 of the Municipality of Burgos, Province of Pangasinan”;
